Eligibility

School students from Year 3 upwards residing in the Central West are invited to join SJO. Schools that have already expressed interest in the program include Gilgandra Public School, Gilgandra High School, Trangie Central School, Eumungerie Public School, and Tooraweenah Public School.

Students can belong to any school and can range from music level beginner-advanced.

Costs

Students enrolled in a Department of Education School will have their enrolment fee subsidised due to the School Services Arts Grant.

Annual subsidised fee: \$60 (Eight rehearsals per annum resulting in two performance opportunities)

Annual fee for non-subsidised students: \$120 (\$15 per rehearsal)

Music stand- supplied

Sheet music and music books- supplied

Travel- at own expense or supplied/supported by SJO affiliated school.

In 2019 Symphonia Jubilate visited Warren on a regional tour. Symphonia Jubilate is a public school symphony orchestra organisation made up of students predominantly from primary and secondary schools in the Strathfield and Canterbury education networks. Founded in 2013 by Tracy Burjan and Luke Wallace, the organisation aims to provide students with an opportunity to rehearse, learn and perform quality orchestral music from a diverse range of musical styles, as well as to foster a new level of music appreciation and skill.

Symphonia Jubilate has donated a variety of instruments available for loan within the SJO Outback program. They seek to help us to continue to build the bank of instruments that I hope we can make available over the years to students hungry to learn and be creative.

Dear Parents

It is with great excitement that we finally move towards the official launch of Symphonia Jubilate Outback (SJO) on **Monday 26 July 2021 4-5:30pm at Gilgandra Public School.**

Students already well along the music learning path, and those wishing to make a start, are invited to learn about music making, join an ensemble, experiment with sound, sing, clap, move and play instruments. Students representing over 10 different schools in the central west, with hundreds of kilometres covered, will meet to make community through music.

Local educators Frances and Nick Evans will be joined by Symphonia Jubilate Director Tracy Burjan and assisted by her talented husband, saxophonist and composer Paul Burjan, to lead students through a variety of fun warm-ups and exercises followed by ensemble pieces.

The vision is clear and exciting. The 'bush' needs a beginner, intermediate and advanced youth orchestra which will strengthen bonds between young people, inspire excellence in music making and support those families who value and pursue music making. Performance opportunities through SJO will allow students in rural NSW to develop performance skills, confidence, ensemble etiquette and empower them to make music learning and performing part of their future.

Aims:

- To form an outback orchestra of Strings, Wind, Brass and Percussion
- Assist in providing affordable ensemble experiences and tuition to students in western NSW that have not yet had the opportunity or exposure to regular music making
- Enable remote students to access high quality music education
- Empower regional and remote teachers to nurture a thriving performing arts culture in their school
- Connect remote families who value music in order to reduce feelings of isolation and/or disadvantage
- Track how the benefits of music making in rural isolated communities can improve the outcomes of all participants across the board both academically and socially
- Provide Symphonia Jubilate Outback participating schools an opportunity to build closer relationships
- Support and empower general classroom teachers who feel they do not have the skills to deliver a high-quality music curriculum. Classroom teachers who want to upskill are invited to attend the rehearsals and workshops. The experience may be viewed as NESAs informal professional development.

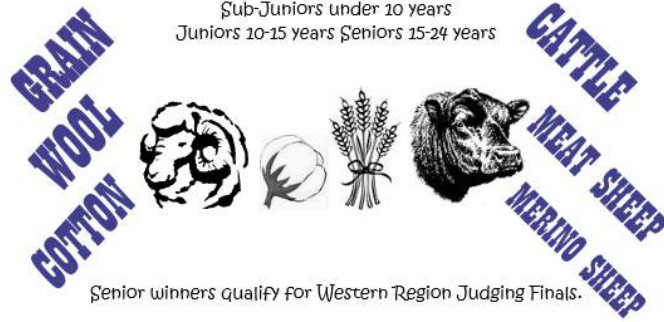

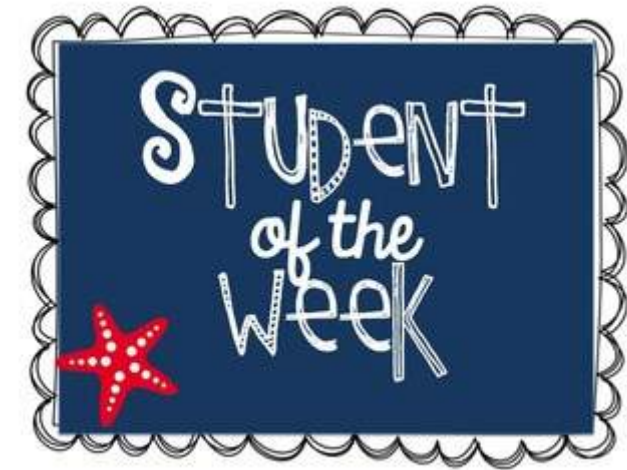

EVERY DAY COUNTS!

Our *School Attendance Officers* will interview students about absences (partial, lateness & truancy).

The law in New South Wales regarding attendance at school is very specific. Children between the ages of 6 and 17 years must attend school on all days the school is open unless there are justified reasons for an absence. All absences must be satisfactorily explained to the school at which the child is enrolled.

You are legally responsible for ensuring that your child/ren attends school each day school is open.

All students' attendance is monitored on a daily basis. It is expected that all students arrive at school on time to begin daily lessons.

All absences can be explained by note, a phone call (6847 4438) or personal explanation from parent/carer.
