Exciting news! Warren Central School now has an Aboriginal Learning and Engagement Centre (ALEC) and an Aboriginal Learning and Engagement Coordinator (ALEC). The Centre will run every Thursday in the Secondary Our Place room, which is near the secondary computer rooms. The Centre will provide wellbeing, academic and cultural support for all Aboriginal students to enhance educational outcomes.

Mrs Karlene Irving has been appointed as the Aboriginal Learning and Engagement Coordinator, supporting Aboriginal Education Officers (AEOs), Mr Peter Mackay and Ms Phyllis Oates.

The ALEC team has been busy purchasing and developing resources for the students. The focus is currently on Secondary students. As the Centre becomes more established, however, Primary students will also be included in the programs run through the Centre.

The Centre's priorities are to:

- equip students to attain Year 12 while maintaining their cultural identity
- assist students so that they excel and achieve in every aspect of their education
- support students to meet their individual learning needs
- strengthen and build each student's cultural awareness, knowledge and identity
- assist in the transition from Primary to Secondary school and Year 10 to Year 11
- ensure each student is known, valued and cared for

Key focus areas of the ALEC are to improve:

- student engagement
- attendance
- retention and
- **HSC** attainment

The ALEC is an initiative of Warren Central School's Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG) and is supervised throughout NSW by Ms Dimiti



Trudgett and her team at the NSW Department of Education. Ms Trudgett was a student at Warren Central School and is currently engaged by the Department of Education to implement ALECs. She has been Deputy Principal at Trangie Central School.

We are excited to provide every student opportunities to experience success in their learning journey. Each student has individual learning needs and so we are also looking forward to supporting students in developing goals which achieve positive outcomes, both personally and within their community.
















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Teenagers and BULLYING BEHAVIOUR

HOW TO SUPPORT IF YOUR CHILD IS BEING BULLIED:

- Tell them that bullying is never okay, and reassure them that it's not their fault.
- Find out what, when and where the bullying occurred and who was involved.
- Discuss ways to stop giving power to the person doing the bullying. For example, by walking away, or ignoring them and their behaviour.
- Reassure them that you will help to stop the bullying from continuing. It can be helpful to discuss any personal experiences you've had with bullying behaviour and how you dealt with it.
- Familiarise yourself with the school's anti-bullying policy and procedures.
- Contact the school to ensure that teachers are aware of the problem, and work out a plan with them for how to address it.

DON'T FORGET:

- Be calm so you have the headspace to deal with the conversation. 'Going off' can make everyone more upset.
- Don't ever suggest retaliation as a response to bullying (because it doesn't work).

Continuous learning is critical for success throughout life and everyone can be a lifelong learner.






