#### **Swimming Scheme**

I cannot stress enough how important it is that your child is able to swim and be a strong swimmer. Every year, hundreds of children drown and many drown due to the fact that they are unable to swim. It is a fact that the one state – Queensland and, the one Territory – Northern Territory, who do not have a mandatory swim scheme also account for the highest number of fatalities per capita as a result.

#### **School Planning**

The executive staff at WCS are currently planning for the 2023 year. How time flies! We will have a number of announcements in terms of improvements to the school over the next few months. Last holidays, every classroom in the school received new blinds and the reverse cycle air conditioning was finished earlier this year. 


