
Merino Wether Challenge

WCS Agriculture and Primary Industries students have again participated in the "School Wether Challenge". We have had seven wethers at school for the past six months being prepared for the challenge. The students have been learning about handling sheep in yards, stock movement and behaviour, feeding and animal health. The wethers were regularly weighed and their feed intake and nutrition monitored as well as being prepared for competition.

Students arrived in Dubbo on Tuesday 23 August and Wednesday 24 August. Upon arrival they helped weigh the sheep and watched our sheep being shorn. 

Year 1





Birthday Buckets can be purchased at the Canteen for \$15. Leave money at the front office and we can organise a Birthday bucket for your child and their class.




Food Technology and Hospitality

Aquaponics

Last week Ian from Aqualife and Mathew from Royal Flying Doctor Service were at the school to update the aquaponics system. Mathew is the GROW coordinator who funded the aquaponic program while Ian is the person who designed and built the system.

To take full advantage of these two experts knowledge, year 7 and the 9/10s went down to the aquaponics system to see how water influences everything we do. Year 7 - Have been studying water in the world and have just finished covering the water cycle. Students went to the aquaponics system to learn about how water can be used for farming, and how very little water is needed to sustain the system. They learned about the closed loop system and how the fish poo is used as food for plants. They have got to handle some yabbies! A quiz at the end by Ian showed the students had absorbed a lot of information.

Year 9/10 - Have been studying environmental change. We have recently covered the hydrological cycle and have started look at plant and animal adaptations in preparation for their projects. Adaptions help plant and animal survive in their environments for example cactus, have adapted to cope with extreme heat and lack of water. Students went to the aquaponics system to learn how yabbies have adapted to their environment. Ian also gave examples of how other animals have adapted to aquatic ecosystems.
